Construction and demolition (C&D) debris present numerous disposal challenges. Some states require C&D debris — including concrete, asphalt, wood, rebar, steel and drywall — to be “processed” (chopped up) prior to disposal, while other states expressly prohibit this practice. In many jurisdictions, traditional Municipal Solid Waste (MSW), such as paper and cardboard, must be separated from C&D prior to disposal. Drywall, one of the most common C&D materials, may emit gases while decomposing, requiring special management. And C&D-specific fees and taxes may apply when debris is landfilled at certain facilities.

To deal effectively with these regulatory variances, construction companies, general contractors, architects and engineers need to work with a waste disposal company that is an expert in the management, transportation and disposal of C&D debris. Such expertise can help C&D generators save time and money, avoid regulatory entanglements and protect themselves from legal liabilities associated with disposing of waste from their construction, demolition or remodeling projects.
